SUMMER INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

WHAT IS IT?

The Students for Economic Justice (SEJ) summer internship is a full-time, intensive 6-week program that provides training on organizing principles and exposes students to leadership and professional development opportunities. SEJ gives undergraduate college students at 2-year or 4-year institutions organizing experience in a current San Diego campaign for economic justice.

WHAT ARE THE ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS?

- Be college undergraduates at either a 2-year or 4-year institution and at least 18 years of age
- Be eligible to work in the U.S.
- Be available full-time (40 hours a week) from June 20-July 28, 2023
- Submit online application form, letter of recommendation, and resume by 11:59p.m. PST, Sunday, March 5, 2023

WHAT DO INTERNS DO?

Interns receive trainings from key community and labor leaders throughout San Diego to build an intersectional approach to economic and social justice. SEJ fellows are placed at sites (e.g. community organizations, advocacy groups, labor unions) to gain hands-on organizing experience, while earning \$22/hour.



IDEAL SEJ CANDIDATES:

- Demonstrate passion and dedication to social and economic justice
- Demonstrate leadership at school, at work, at home, and/or in the community
- Demonstrate an interest in labor or community organizing as a potential career path
- Dedicated to advancing the San Diego region
- Has lived in San Diego and plans to stay in San Diego long-term
